

OLD MILVERTON AND BLACKDOWN JOINT PARISH COUNCIL

MINUTES OF THE MEETING HELD ON MONDAY, 15TH OCTOBER 2018 AT OLD MILVERTON VILLAGE HALL

PRESENT: Councillors Mrs.A.Kelsey (in the Chair), J.Emmerson, Mrs. L.Keeling, and W.M.O. Tansey; County and District Councillor W.L.Gifford.

APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE: Councillor J.M.Lander; County Councillor W.Redford; District Councillors Miss H. Grainger and Mrs. A Stevens.

1925. MINUTES OF PREVIOUS MEETING

The minutes of the meeting held on 10th. September 2018 were approved for signature by the Chairman.

1926. MATTERS ARISING FROM PREVIOUS MINUTES

- (a). Councillor Gifford had forwarded to Cllr. Lander details of the Birmingham Airport Consultative Committee which had an independent chairman since this might be an effective medium for querying the recent constant low-flying aircraft over the area.
- (b). The Saxon Mill Bridge had re-opened, though there was still work to be carried out.
- (c). The setts had been re-fixed on Old Milverton Village Green .

1927. CORRESPONDENCE AND ANNOUNCEMENTS

- (a). Details of the primary gritting routes for winter 2018-2019 had been received, which indicated that Old Milverton Lane and Road had been included.
- (b). Sandy Lane was regarded as an essential area (third in order) for Speed Gun operations by Rural East Community Forum.

1928. ADOPTION OF GENERAL PRIVACY POLICY

After discussion it was resolved to adopt the General Privacy Policy under the General Data Protection Regulations (GDPR) as at Appendix A. This would be included on the Parish Council's website.

1929. PLANNING APPLICATIONS

- (a). The Parish Council confirmed the following observations:

W18/1650 Moorfields Rugby Football Club, Kenilworth Road, Blackdown

Change of use of part car part to hand car wash with associated works

OBSERVATIONS: Objection on detailed grounds since the proposal was considered to be totally inadequate for the site and similar arguments used in objecting to Planning Application W19/0365 (Minute no. 1888 of 19th. March 2018) which differed mainly only in the re-positioning of the car-wash.

W18/1810 Helen Ley Care Centre, Bericote Road, Blackdown

Adjustment of roof pitch and general repairs (retrospective).

OBSERVATIONS: No objection since the works were to bring roof up to date. However, in the absence of greater detail if they constituted a significant alteration from the original, the Parish Council would wish to re-consider. There would also be concerns if the alterations resulted in undue pressures on the drainage system.

(b). Observations had been received from the Planning Officer regarding the application for a Certificate of Lawfulness for development at Malle Manor, Sandy Lane, Blackdown, which satisfied the Parish Council that its concerns and queries were being taken into account.

(c). The Enforcement Officer had inspected Chesford Bridge House where there had been apparent activities of concern to the Parish Council. A site inspection had found no sign of an advertisement or marquee. A large advertisement would require consent to display; use of the land for a marquee is permitted (with certain exceptions) for a period of 28 days in a year and it was likely that the observed use would fall into this category.

(d) A discussion had taken place with a representative of the Wasps Coventry Rugby Football Club to explain the outlines of its proposals for development at Old Leamingtonians Rugby Football Club, Bericote Road, Blackdown, in respect of which a planning application was expected in due course.

1930. APPROVAL OF ACCOUNT

The payment specified in the schedule provided for Members was approved and a cheque were issued immediately following the meeting.

1931. ITEMS FOR FORTHCOMING MEETINGS

(a). It was agreed that the Highways Engineer be approached about the possibility of improving the surface of the parking area at the Old Barn, Old Milverton.

(b). It was agreed that the Enforcement Officer be asked to inspect the Old Barn, Old Milverton (a Listed Building) since it would appear that repairs were necessary.

(c). Parts of the foot ways in Old Milverton Road were overgrown with brambles and the like and it was agreed to ask the Highways Engineer to arrange clearance on the grounds of health and safety concerns.

(d). Concern was expressed about the recent proliferation of large vehicle transporters through Old Milverton Village and the Clerk was asked to approach the Vauxhall Garage and the Deeley Group which was carrying out development at Quarry Street, requesting that its suppliers did not use this route.

(e). County Councillor Gifford outlined proposals for local cycle routes, particularly between Leamington and Kenilworth and agreed to supply details in case the Parish Council wished to endorse any part of the proposals..

GENERAL PRIVACY NOTICE

Your personal data – what is it?

“Personal data” is any information about a living individual, which allows them to be identified from that data (for example a name, photographs, videos, email address, or address). Identification can be by directly using the data itself or by combining it with other information, which helps to identify a living individual. The processing of personal data is governed by legislation relating to personal data, which applies in the United Kingdom including the General Data Protection Regulation (the “GDPR”) and other legislation relating to personal data and rights such as the Human Rights Act.

Who are we?

This Privacy Notice is provided by Old Milverton and Blackdown Joint Parish Council which is the data controller for your data.

Other data controllers the Parish Council might work with:

- Warwickshire County Council
- Warwick District Council
- Community groups
- Charities
- Other not-for-profit entities
- Contractors

We may need to share your personal data we hold with them so that they can carry out their responsibilities to the Parish Council. If we and the other data controllers listed above are processing your data jointly for the same purposes, then the Parish Council and the other data controllers may be “joint data controllers” which mean we are all collectively responsible to you for your data. Where each of the parties listed above are processing your data for their own independent purposes then each of us will be independently responsible to you and if you have any questions, wish to exercise any of your rights (see below) or wish to raise a complaint, you should do so directly to the relevant data controller.

A description of what personal data the Parish Council processes and for what purposes is set out in this Privacy Notice.

The Parish Council will process some or all of the following personal data where necessary to perform its tasks, though some of the elements are extremely unlikely:

- Names, titles, and aliases, photographs;
- Contact details such as telephone numbers, addresses, and email addresses;
- Where they are relevant to the services provided by a council, or where you provide them to us, we may process information such as gender, age, marital status, nationality, education/work history, academic/professional qualifications, hobbies, family composition, and dependants;
- Where you make payment to the Parish Council, financial identifiers such as bank account numbers, payment card numbers, payment/transaction identifiers, policy numbers, and claim numbers;
- The personal data we process may include sensitive or other special categories of personal data such as criminal convictions, racial or ethnic origin, mental and physical health, details

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of injuries, medication/treatment received, political beliefs, trade union affiliation, genetic data, biometric data, data concerning and sexual life or orientation.

How we use sensitive personal data

- We may process sensitive personal data including, as appropriate:
 - your racial or ethnic origin or religious or similar information in to monitor compliance with equal opportunities legislation;
 - to comply with legal requirements and obligations to third parties.
- These types of data are described in the GDPR as "Special categories of data" and require higher levels of protection. We need to have further justification for collecting, storing and using this type of personal data.
- We may process special categories of personal data in the following circumstances:
 - In limited circumstances, with your explicit written consent.
 - Where we need to carry out our legal obligations.
 - Where it is needed in the public interest.
- Less commonly, we may process this type of personal data where it is needed in relation to legal claims or where it is needed to protect your interests (or someone else's interests) and you are not capable of giving your consent, or where you have already made the information public.

Do we need your consent to process your sensitive personal data?

- In limited circumstances, we may approach you for your written consent to allow us to process certain sensitive personal data. If we do so, we will provide you with full details of the personal data that we would like and the reason we need it, so that you can carefully consider whether you wish to consent.

The council will comply with data protection law. This says that the personal data we hold about you must be:

- Used lawfully, fairly and in a transparent way.
- Collected only for valid purposes that we have clearly explained to you and not used in any way that is incompatible with those purposes.
- Relevant to the purposes we have told you about and limited only to those purposes.
- Accurate and kept up to date.
- Kept only as long as necessary for the purposes we have told you about.
- Kept and destroyed securely including ensuring that appropriate technical and security measures are in place to protect your personal data to protect personal data from loss, misuse, unauthorised access and disclosure.

We use your personal data for some or all of the following purposes:

- To deliver public services including to understand your needs to provide the services that you request and to understand what we can do for you and inform you of other relevant services;
- To confirm your identity to provide some services;
- To contact you by post, email, telephone or using social media (e.g., Facebook, Twitter, WhatsApp);
- To help us to build up a picture of how we are performing;

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- To prevent and detect fraud and corruption in the use of public funds and where necessary for the law enforcement functions;
- To enable us to meet all legal and statutory obligations and powers including any delegated functions;
- To carry out comprehensive safeguarding procedures (including due diligence and complaints handling) in accordance with best safeguarding practice from time to time with the aim of ensuring that all children and adults-at-risk are provided with safe environments and generally as necessary to protect individuals from harm or injury;
- To promote the interests of the council;
- To maintain our own accounts and records;
- To seek your views, opinions or comments;
- To notify you of changes to our facilities, services, events and staff, councillors and other role holders;
- To send you communications which you have requested and that may be of interest to you. These may include information about campaigns, appeals, other new projects or initiatives;
- To process relevant financial transactions including grants and payments for goods and services supplied to the council
- To allow the statistical analysis of data so we can plan the provision of services.

Our processing may also include the use of CCTV systems for the prevention and prosecution of crime.

What is the legal basis for processing your personal data?

The council is a public authority and has certain powers and obligations. Most of your personal data is processed for compliance with a legal obligation which includes the discharge of the council's statutory functions and powers. Sometimes when exercising these powers or duties it is necessary to process personal data of residents or people using the council's services. We will always take into account your interests and rights. This Privacy Notice sets out your rights and the council's obligations to you.

We may process personal data if it is necessary for the performance of a contract with you, or to take steps to enter into a contract.

Sometimes the use of your personal data requires your consent. We will first obtain your consent to that use.

Sharing your personal data

This section provides information about the third parties with whom the council may share your personal data. These third parties have an obligation to put in place appropriate security measures and will be responsible to you directly for the manner in which they process and protect your personal data. It is likely that we will need to share your data with some or all of the following (but only where necessary):

- The data controllers listed above under the heading "Other data controllers the council works with";
- Our agents, suppliers and contractors. For example, we may ask a commercial provider to publish or distribute newsletters on our behalf, or to maintain our database software;
- On occasion, other local authorities or not for profit bodies with which we are carrying out joint ventures e.g. in relation to facilities or events for the community.

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How long do we keep your personal data?

We will keep some records permanently if we are legally required to do so. We may keep some other records for an extended period of time. For example, it is currently best practice to keep financial records for a minimum period of 8 years to support HMRC audits or provide tax information. We may have legal obligations to retain some data in connection with our statutory obligations as a public authority. The council is permitted to retain data to defend or pursue claims. In some cases the law imposes a time limit for such claims (for example 3 years for personal injury claims or 6 years for contract claims). We will retain some personal data for this purpose as long as we believe it is necessary to be able to defend or pursue a claim. In general, we will endeavour to keep data only for as long as we need it. This means that we will delete it when it is no longer needed.

Your rights and your personal data

You have the following rights with respect to your personal data:

When exercising any of the rights listed below, in order to process your request, we may need to verify your identity for your security. In such cases we will need you to respond with proof of your identity before you can exercise these rights.

1) ***The right to access personal data we hold on you***

- At any point you can contact us to request the personal data we hold on you as well as why we have that personal data, who has access to the personal data and where we obtained the personal data from. Once we have received your request we will respond within one month.
- There are no fees or charges for the first request but additional requests for the same personal data or requests which are manifestly unfounded or excessive may be subject to an administrative fee.

2) ***The right to correct and update the personal data we hold on you***

- If the data we hold on you is out of date, incomplete or incorrect, you can inform us and your data will be updated.

3) ***The right to have your personal data erased***

- If you feel that we should no longer be using your personal data or that we are unlawfully using your personal data, you can request that we erase the personal data we hold.
- When we receive your request we will confirm whether the personal data has been deleted or the reason why it cannot be deleted (for example because we need it for to comply with a legal obligation).

4) ***The right to object to processing of your personal data or to restrict it to certain purposes only***

- You have the right to request that we stop processing your personal data or ask us to restrict processing. Upon receiving the request we will contact you and let you know if we are able to comply or if we have a legal obligation to continue to process your data.

5) ***The right to data portability***

- You have the right to request that we transfer some of your data to another controller. We will comply with your request, where it is feasible to do so, within one month of receiving your request.

6) ***The right to withdraw your consent to the processing at any time for any processing of data to which consent was obtained***

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- You can withdraw your consent easily by telephone, email, or by post (see Contact Details below).
- 7) ***The right to lodge a complaint with the Information Commissioner's Office.***

Transfer of Data Abroad

Any personal data transferred to countries or territories outside the European Economic Area ("EEA") will only be placed on systems complying with measures giving equivalent protection of personal rights either through international agreements or contracts approved by the European Union. Our website is also accessible from overseas so on occasion some personal data (for example in an information item) may be accessed from overseas.

Further processing

If we wish to use your personal data for a new purpose, not covered by this Privacy Notice, then we will provide you with a new notice explaining this new use prior to commencing the processing and setting out the relevant purposes and processing conditions. Where and whenever necessary, we will seek your prior consent to the new processing.

Changes to this notice

We keep this Privacy Notice under regular review and we will place any updates on this web page. This Notice was last updated in September 2018.

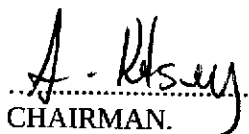
